## Flow Chart on Service to dependency Cases

Welfare Section develops Resettlement Studies with individual and family groups whose situations call for special services. As during the course of consultation, it becomes evident that there is need for special health, social services and or financial assistance for partial or total support, temporarily or for an indefinite period of time, or for purchasing the original outlay of furniture and meeting the first month's expenses, etc., a memorandum will be prepared, addressed to the Department of Public Welfare, or other appropriate agency in the locality to which the residents wish to go, according to instruction 30.4.62 and 63. This memorandum will be directed to the appropriate Area office, to the attention of the Relocation Adjustment Advisor, with necessary documents, including three copies of WRA Form #390.

The Relocation Adjustment advisor will be responsible for consultation with the appropriate agency, the transmittal of the memorandum and forms presenting data about application, including three copies of WRA Form #390.

The agency will review the contents of the memorandum and accompanying documents and either approve the case as one for which they will take responsibility without further information, and indicate so on the WRA Form 390, or indicate the question they must ask, or adjustments they suggest in the plan. When the agency can approve the plan (upon either the original presentation of application, or after further negotiation with the Welfare Section of the Center) the agency will make proper entries in WRA Form 390, retain one copy of the forms, and complete entries under "disposition".

The Relocation Adjustment Advisor will upon receiving the returned two copies of WRA Form 390 will retain one copy of WRA Form 390 return the third copy to the Project Director to the attention of the Welfare Section.

If the returned WRA Form 390 bears indication of need for further consultation with the family, the Welfare Section will proceed with such consultation and will forward a revised plan to the Relocation Adjustment Advisor for presentation to the agency.

When the returned Form 390 indicates the approval of the proposed plan, by the agency, the Welfare Section will proceed to complete the Resettlement Study with the cooperation of the individuals concerned. Upon completion of the Study the appropriate number of copies of the Study with necessary documents (at least Forms 329, 340, and 390, and 76a if public assistance is to be granted) will be directed to the relocation Program Officer with a covering letter addressed to the appropriate Area Office, to the attention of the Relocation Adjustment Advisor, over the signature of the Relocation Program Officer's name.

The Relocation Program Officer, will review the documents for completion according to instructions and send the materials as indicated.

The Relocation Adjustment Advisor will review the enclosures and share materials as indicated with the appropriate agency or agencies.

The Agency keeping a copy of the Form 390 indicating the approval of the plan will take major responsibility for receiving the individual or family upon arrival in the city.
