UTAH PUBLIC OPINION SURVEY

August 19-26, 1942

In a poll of public opinion in Utah, 65.6 per cent of 4,999 persons interviewed expressed approval of a policy permitting citizen-Japanese to leave relocation centers and accept outside employment, but only 18.1 per cent of those in the poll would approve of alien Japanese being permitted to work outside the centers. Of those who favored permitting American citizens among the evacuees to work outside the centers, only 52 per cent favored having them in the immediate vicinity where the interviews took place.

Townspeople were more in favor of permitting American citizen Japanese to take outside employment than were farmers. Of farmers interviewed, 59.6 per cent expressed themselves in favor of such a policy, compared with 67.6 per cent of city residents and 64 per cent of small-town persons interviewed.

The poll was taken of a representative cross-section of the population, with the state divided into four districts and interviews distributed in proportion to the total population over 21 years of age, in classifications as to (a) income, (b) sex, (c) urban and rural, and consideration given also to age, occupation and suffrage factors. The Western Institute of Public Opinion made the survey at the request of OWI and WRA.

Typical comments of those who felt that citizen-Japanese should not be permitted to work outside the centers were: "So many are Americans but disloyal too...Once a Jap, always a Jap...Can't depend on them... Don't trust them...Too smart, crafty, deceitful...Can't tell loyal from disloyal...Potential saboteurs...Should be sent home to Japan...Lock them up...Don't let them compete with American labor...High school boys can work the farms..."

Many of those who would permit citizen-Japanese to accept outside employment qualified their opinion with statements that such workers should be "closely guarded...must be restricted...should be supervised..." Other typical comments of this group were: "Need their help...Good farm workers...Only where needed...If don't take other men's jobs...Shouldn't just waste time...If thoroughly reliable...If loyal...If can be trusted... If not too close to defense centers...If Americanized..."

## INTRODUCTION

### METHOD:

A total of 4999 personal interviews were conducted with a representative cross-section of the population in Utah, using the questionnaire shown on the following page.

Interviewing was conducted on a house-to-house basis as far as possible, but in order to get a representative cross-section of working men, some interviews were made in places of business and on the street.

Detailed questionnaire instructions were given each investigator, in addition to personal instruction and supervision. Copy of these Detailed Questionnaire Instructions follow.

## DETAILED QUESTIONNAIRE INSTRUCTIONS

Questions 1 & 2 - These are long involved questions so read them slowly. The point we want emphasized in the first question is that these Japanese are AMERICAN CITIZENS - and in the second question that these 25,000 Japanese are NOT American Citizens. Otherwise the two questions are virtually the same.

As possible answers we have printed on the questionnaire "inside", "outside" and "don't know", which we want you to check accordingly, but in each case we have left a blank line after these possible answers for you to record respondent's reply as near as possible in their own wording. For example, if respondent should answer, "I think it is all right for them to work outside if properly supervised" - then you would check "outside" and on the blank line following write in "if properly supervised."

The second part to these questions should be asked ONLY if respondent answers "outside" -- or, in other words, if you have a cross after "outside" in the first part of the question - then ask the second part, otherwise skip it and go on to the next question.

The answer to this second part should result in a yes - no - don't know answer. However, if they should, for example, answer "depends" - find out "depends on what" - and write in their own words on the blank line provided.

Question 3 - This question should result in only a "yes" or "no" answer - Respondent might, of course, reply "I haven't been in the State long enough", or some similar answer but you should always be able to record it under either "yes" or "no".

Question 4 - For occupation we want the occupation of the head of the family - or the occupation of the fellow responsible for their style of living - the main breadwinner. In recording these occupations, fill in the information explicitly. We want to know the nature of the business in which the respondent is employed, and, further, just what type of work the respondent does in that business.

Controls - "Urban" interviews are interviews with people living in cities of 2500 population, or over, regardless of occupation. "Rural" interviews are interviews with farmers living in towns or rural communities with a population under 2500. No interview can be considered a rural interview unless respondent makes his living from farming, and resides in a community with a population under 2500. "Non-farm" interviews are interviews with people who also live in towns or rural communities with a population under 2500, but who make their living from anything EXCEPT farming.

TABULATION:

Completed interviews were carefully edited before tabulation was started. Tabulation was made By Districts, and By Urban, Non-Farm, and Rural, and results are shown in this report accordingly.

In addition to these tabulations, a tabulation was made of the remarks on the various questions, and are shown in this report broken down by ways in which the question was answered.

Each table contains the base figure on which percentages have been computed, and percentages have been carried out one point.

DISTRIBUTION OF INTERVIEWS:

The survey sample was based on 5,000 interviews in Utah. The State was divided into four districts, and interviews were distributed in each district in exact proportion to the total population over 21 years of age in each of the following classifications:

- (a) Income class
- (b) Sex
- (c) Urban, Non-Farm Rural, and Rural

A statistical table which shows this breakdown of the State totals, and compares these figures with the survey sample follows this page.

Three other factors considered were the age factor, occupational factor, and suffrage factor. These factors, however, were not considered except indirectly in making up the sample. Statistical tables showing the distribution of interviews obtained in these classifications follow.

In addition, maps are included which show the districts into which the State was divided, and the cities, towns and rural areas covered in each district by this survey.


