Abstract: Eric Frederick Goldman (1915-1989) was born in Washington, D.C. He was a professor of history at Princeton University, special consultant to President Johnson (1963-66) and wrote many books. The collection consists of a manuscript with holograph corrections, galley proofs, and a typescript index for Goldman's book titled, *The Crucial Decade: America, 1945-1955*.

Biography

Goldman was born June 17, 1915 in Washington, D.C.; MA (1935), Ph.D (1938), Johns Hopkins University; instructor in history, Johns Hopkins University (1938-41); writer, *Time* magazine (1941-43); assistant professor (1943-47), associate professor (1947-55), and professor of history (1955-62), Princeton University; special consultant to President Johnson (1963-66); member, Society of American Historians, American Historical Association, Phi Beta Kappa; winner, Bancroft Prize in history (1952) for *Rendezvous With Destiny*; wrote many books, including *Rendezvous With Destiny: a History of Modern American Reform* (1952), *The Crucial Decade: America, 1945-1955* (1956), and *The Tragedy of Lyndon Johnson: a Historian's Personal Memoir* (1968); died February 19, 1989 in Princeton, New Jersey.
